



Cultural Enthusiasts Embark on 1600 Km Ride for Rotary, Covering 13 Countries

Udaipur: Cultural enthusiasts and participants of the Ride for Rotary rally from Rotary District 3181, Mysore, Karnataka, commenced their 1600 km journey today, showcasing green flags before embarking on their expedition. The rally, organized with the support of the Rotary Club Foundation, started from Udaipur instead of Jaipur due to the longer distance to Goa. A welcoming ceremony for the participants was organized by the Rotary Club Ashwarya at Ashwarya College in Chitrakoot Nagar, Udaipur, featuring a traditional Indian-style reception. Ashwarya Singh, the president of Ashwarya Club, mentioned that the rally is being conducted with the support of the Rotary Club Foundation. He explained that the initial plan

was to organize the rally from Jaipur, but the starting point was shifted to Udaipur to cover the longer distance to Goa. The 15-day rally will cover 1600 km, passing through five states – Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa, and Karnataka. He added that the rally provides an excellent opportunity for the Rotary Club to engage in an international service project with cultural significance. The club feels honored to be part of such a project that enhances the global network of Rotarians and allows for shared experiences, contributing to various service projects where Rotarians can play a significant role. Participants from 13 countries, including the USA, UK, Romania, France, Australia, Norway, Poland, Germany,

Vice President Harshvardhan Singh informed that all 45 members of the team were flagged off with green flags, marking the beginning of the next leg of their journey. The ride will cover a route that passes through the scenic landscapes of Rajasthan, Gujarat, Maharashtra, Goa,

and Karnataka, offering participants a unique cultural experience. The welcoming event featured introductions of each participant, showcasing the cultural richness of their respective countries and sharing personal experiences. Performances by Rotaractors Feba, RTR Komal Bhoi, and Sumitra Group added a vibrant touch to the occasion. Local dignitaries, including former principal Nirmal Singhvi,

Amit Shah Ensures Affordable Medicines Reach Rural Areas Through PM Jan Aushadhi Kendras via PEX

Union Home and Cooperation Minister, Amit Shah, emphasized that through the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Jan Aushadhi Kendras (PM Jan Aushadhi Kendras), affordable and high-quality medicines will now be accessible to the rural poor via the Public eXpenditure (PEX) platform. Under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the adept guidance of Amit Shah in promoting cooperative movements, extensive efforts are being made to make PEX multifunctional. In this regard, 2,373 PEX outlets are being established across five states.

Shah highlighted the pivotal role played by cooperative movements in strengthening the Antyodaya (upliftment of the last person) policy. The establishment of PM Jan Aushadhi Kendras through the cooperative and health sectors is viewed as a convergence of prosperity and good health. Shah noted that the initiative has initially benefited urban underprivileged populations, as the Jan Aushadhi Kendras were predominantly located in urban areas. However, with the integration of PEX, the availability of affordable medicines is extended to the rural poor and farmers.

The minister expressed a clear belief that the synergy between the cooperative and health sectors is essential for comprehensive development and good health. Currently, around 2,300 PEX outlets are operational in Gujarat, Jammu and Kashmir, Karnataka, Madhya Pradesh, Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal, and Northeastern states, working to bring affordable medicines to rural areas.

In a symbolic gesture, five PEX outlets from Maharashtra, Bihar, Jammu and Kashmir, Uttar Pradesh, and Andhra Pradesh received certificates. As part of the commitment to eradicate poverty and uplift the poor, Union Home and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah, under his skilled guidance, has directed the Ministry of Cooperation to expedite the establishment of 200,000 new PEX outlets, ensuring their reach to every Panchayat.

City Representative Offers Suggestions for New Hill Policy to UDA Officials



Udaipur: In preparation for the new hill policy aimed at conserving the Aravalli hills, the Udaipur Development Authority (UDA) is seeking sugges-

tions from city representatives. City legislator Tarachand Jain, along with UDA officials, conducted an inspection of the Ramgiri hills in Badgaon on Monday. Subsequently, in a meeting with UDA officials at the Udaipur Sabha Ghar, Jain presented his recommendations. UDA Regional Commissioner Rajendra Bhatt directed relevant officials to incorporate the suggestions into the draft of the new policy. During the visit, Jain was briefed by Bhatt about the ongoing development work, spanning the past few years, involving planting nearly 8 to 9 thousand trees on 25 hectares of land by the Urban Improvement Trust (UIT). Bhatt informed Jain that the Ramgiri hills are being developed as an oxygen park for the city, aligning with the plan to create oxygen parks on hills in all four corners of the city. This initiative is part of the larger goal to develop such parks in an effort to save the hills from encroachment and other activities.

Jain commended this initiative, stating that the conservation of hills is essential for safeguarding the catchment areas of lakes, which are considered the lifeline of the city. He emphasized the need to incorporate these facts into the new hill policy. Following this, Jain suggested preparing a detailed project report for the new oxygen park. Additionally, he expressed the importance of protecting the hills to ensure the continued flow of water into the lakes, preventing adverse effects on the catchment areas. UDA Chairman Bhatt mentioned that a specialized committee, comprising experts from UDA, urban planning, revenue, forest, irrigation departments, along with GIS experts and architects, will be formed soon to draft the new hill policy. The survey of the hills within a 20-kilometer aerial radius of Sajjangarh will be conducted, and based on the findings, a classification of the hills will be made. The committee will then prepare a report, which will be sent to the state government for the formulation of new rules in line with the directives of the High Court.
