## Alleged Scams Worth Crores in Rajasthan Health Scheme

Rajasthan State Employees Federation (TSP) and Rajasthan Teachers' Union have called for a thorough investigation into alleged scams worth crores of rupees in the Rajasthan Government Health Scheme (RGHS). The demand includes iling cases against the culprits and taking stringent action.

Cancellation of Medication for RGHS Cardholders Medical stores authorized by RGHS have stopped supplying medicines for the past four months, citing non-payment issues. As a result, patients are now purchasing medicines

In Banswara, Rajasthan, TSP Secretary Siyaram, along with other union officials, revealed that medical store operators authorized by RGHS have ceased the sale of essential medicines, including those for kidney, blood pressure, sugar, and heart conditions. Suppliers are also withholding essential supplies due to non-payment.

Association Meetings and Supply Halt

Recently, the Rajasthan RGHS Authorized Medicine Vendor Association convened a meeting involving over 3500 medical store operators statewide. During the meeting, a decision was made to cease the supply of medicines. Coordination in Jaipur by Drug Association

address various flaws in the portal. The agreement stated that bills would be settled within 21 days, but the government and

agencies are not adhering to this timeline. This delay has caused distress among medicine suppliers. Concerns About Product Listing and Bill Reduction The association raised concerns about the government's product list, insisting that only items available in the market should be included. Some products are listed as negative,

creating difficulties for suppliers. Additionally, bill reductions e occurring, with TPAs rejecting bills without valid reasons Demands for High-Level Inquiry

Ajoint memorandum signed by prominent officials, includng Siyaram Sharma (State Administrative Head) and Navin Sharma (State Chief Minister), has been sent to the Chief Minister, Health Minister, and the Governor, urging a highlevel inquiry into the alleged scams. The memorandum demands swift and strict action against those involved.

Backed by global private equity firm EQT, which became its majority owner in July 2023, Indira IVF aims to extend its services to South-East Asian, Middle-Eastern, European, and African countries. The move responds to the global challenge of infertility, affecting one in six people, and aligns with India's prominence in medical tourism. The organization plans to provide comprehensive fertility solutions, with Nepal being its first destination, aiming to establish five more clinics nationwide.

#### Successful Treatment of Patient Suffering from Hemoptysis Udaipur: Physicians at the Pacific Institute

of Medical Sciences (PIMS) Hospital, Umarda, have successfully treated a patient who had been suffering from a severe illness for the

Chairman of PIMS, Ashish Agrawal, shared that a 40-year-old resident of Udaipur had been experiencing symptoms of asthma, coughing, and hemoptysis (coughing up blood) for the last six months. Due to these ailments, the patient was admitted to PIMS Hospital recently. X-rays revealed a radio-opaque shadow in the left midzone. Additionally, a CT scan showed subsegmental atelectasis in the upper lobe with a hypodense lesion, indicating a hydatid cyst.

A bronchoscopy was planned by the respiratory team, led by Dr. Sanidhya Tank, Dr. Gurmaehar Singh Thethi, Dr. Arpit Jauhar, Dr. Shubhanish Choudhary, Dr. Gaurang Singh Jadon, Dr. Abdul Wahab Mirza, and technician Giriraj. The bronchoscopy successfully identified laminated structures resembling a laminated cyst wall. Subsequently, the patient underwent surgery, and the cystic lesion was removed. Histopathology confirmed the pres-

ence of a hydatid cyst with fungal infection. The patient was prescribed antifungal medication and was discharged after successful treatment. The respiratory department at PIMS emphasized the importance of thorough examination and appropriate action in cases like these, as hemoptysis related to hemoptysis can sometimes lead to fatal outcomes.
