



Challenges Faced by Women and Children in India : Bridging the Gulf Between Rhetoric and Reality

In 2015, the launch of the 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' campaign by the Union Ministry of Women and Child Development, accompanied by Prime Minister Narendra Modi's endorsement of the #SelfieWithDaughter social media initiative, symbolized a commitment to educating and empowering girls. However, the recent ground report from the Unified District Information System for Education (UDISE) presents a stark contrast. Over 20,000 schools were shut down in just one year, and the dropout rates for children in classes 1 to 8 doubled, raising concerns about the impact of the New Education Policy (NEP) 2020, which appears to hinder girls' access to education due to increased privatization and associated expenses. Despite the government's emphasis on 'Beti Padhao,' budgetary allocations in the social sector have decreased significantly. From 4.6% in

2014-15, the allocation plummeted to 2.5% in 2023-24, impacting critical initiatives like mid-day meals and 'Beti Bachao,' which witnessed massive cuts. The merger of Integrated Child Development Services (ICDS) into Pradhan Mantri Poshan Shakti Nirman (PM POSHAN) saw a rise in financial outlay, yet the effectiveness of this transformation remains to be seen. Similar reductions are evident in women- and child-related schemes such as the National Creche Scheme, Scheme for Adolescent Girls, and the maternity benefit scheme, despite India having the highest number of malnourished women globally. Examining the widely touted Pradhan Mantri Ujjwala Yojana, which distributed LPG connections to women below the poverty line, reveals a discrepancy between claims and reality. While 93.4 million beneficiaries were reached by April 2022, high LPG cylinder prices deterred families from refilling. This disparity is exemplified by the statement from the Minister



for Petroleum and Natural Gas, Rameshwar Teji, revealing that millions did not take refills in 2021. Another critical concern is the purported electrification of 18 lakh villages, juxtaposed against stagnant power consumption growth at 5% per annum. The Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana mirrors the Ujjwala scheme, illustrating that even with a free connection, poor households lack the means to purchase metered electricity. The decline in the Labor Force Participation Rate (LFPR) of women over the last nine years, from 27% in 2012 to 23.9% in 2021, signals a worrisome trend. The Center for New Economics Studies attributes this decline to women transitioning from salaried employment to poorly paid self-employment in the unorga-

nized sector, particularly post-COVID. Despite the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (MGNREGA) aiming to provide a safety net for the poor, drastic budgetary cuts of 33% in the current financial year have hindered its efficacy. The allocation, now at Rs 60,000 crore, is primarily used to clear wage backlogs, exacerbating the challenges faced by women in availing themselves of this crucial scheme, especially with the added complexity of Aadhaar-linked payments. Healthcare expenditure across the country has reached catastrophic proportions, contributing significantly to rural indebtedness. Inequities in health facilities between states and districts have driven the proliferation of expensive private healthcare in rural India. Notably, the expenditure on health remains dismally low, fluctuating between 1.2% and 2.2% of the budgetary outlay between 2014-15 and 2022-23. The gap between rhetoric and reality in these key areas is evident, demanding urgent attention and concrete actions to address the challenges faced by women and children in India. Efforts should be directed towards aligning budgetary allocations with the lofty goals of campaigns like 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' and ensuring that policies translate into meaningful improvements in the lives of the most vulnerable populations.
