Successful Treatment of a **Severe Stroke Patient at GMCH**

Udaipur: Geetanjali Medical College and Hospital, Udaipur, is known for providing multidisciplinary treatment approaches to its patients. Recently, a 58-year-old resident of Udaipur was given a new lease on life after a successful treatment at the hospital. The treatment team, supervised by the Head of the Neurology Department, Dr. Nishant Ashwani, included Neurologist Dr. Nishant Ashwani, Resident Dr. Dhruv, ICU doctors Dr. Shubhkaran Sharma, Dr. Sanjay Paliwal, Dr. Syed Javed, and supporting staff.

Detailed Information:

Dr. Nishant Ashwani explained that the patient had suffered a stroke two years ago and had subsequently stopped taking his medication. In November 2023, the patient experienced another stroke and was brought to Geetanjali Hospital's emergency department in an unconscious state, complaining of severe headache, dizziness, and vomiting.

Given the patient's critical condition, he was immediately admitted to the ICU. An MRI confirmed the occurrence of a stroke, primarily affecting the posterior part of the brain, which also impaired his vision. After four days, the patient was shift-



ed from the ICU to a regular ward. He is now healthy, leading a normal life, and regularly visiting the hospital for consultations. It is crucial for stroke or high blood pressure patients to continue their medication without interruption unless advised by a doctor. Regular medication intake can prevent the recurrence of strokes. This patient's condition became critical because he had stopped taking his medication without consulting a doctor. Special care and attention are essential after a stroke; neglecting it can be fatal.

Students Deserve Justice Where NEET Irregularities Occurred: Nitin Vijay

Kota: Educationist and founder of Motion Education, CEO Nitin Vijay, stated that the new proposal by the National Testing Agency (NTA) will not deliver justice to the thousands of students affected by irregularities in the NEET exam, during the Supreme Court hearing on Thursday. NTA has proposed canceling the scorecards of 1,563 candidates who received grace marks and conducting a re-exam for them on June 23, with results to be announced before June 30.

Nitin Vijay addressed journalists on Thursday, asserting that NTA should acknowledge and rectify instances of paper leaks, cheating, and time wastage wherever they occurred. If this is not feasible, the entire exam should be retaken. The 1,563 students in question approached the court to complain about time wastage, but many others faced similar issues and could

have filed petitions regarding NEET examirregularities in various states.

Merely canceling the scorecards of the 1,563 candidates who received grace marks will not ensure justice for all. Last year, a score of 600 corresponded to a rank of 30,000, whereas this year, it corresponds to a rank of 81,000. This 51,000-rank difference cannot be solely attributed to an increase in talent level or grace marks, indicating significant issues with exam leakage and cheating. There have been reports of irregularities in Patna, where students claimed to have received the paper a night before the exam, and in Gujarat. NTA should identify centers where cheating led to abnormally high scores and offer a re-exam at all such

Nitin Vijay mentioned that the Supreme Court had already accepted the PIL of 20,000 students from across the country for a hearing on Wednesday, with the hearing scheduled for Friday. PMCH: New Life to 2-Year-Old Chetna by **Removing Cashew Piece**

Udaipur: Doctors from the ENT department at Pacific Medical College and Hospital (PMCH) have given a new lease on life to a 2-year-old girl named Chetna by successfully removing piece of cashew from her windpipe.

Chetna, a resident of Kanpur Madri in Udaipur, experienced difficulty breathing, persistent coughing, chest pain, and throat swelling after a cashew piece got lodged in her windpipe while eating. Her parents rushed her to PMCH's emergency department when they noticed her distress. In the emergency room, ENT specialist Dr. Shiv Kaushik promptly conducted a CT scan, which revealed a foreign object stuck in the main airways of both lungs, causing significant breathing difficulties.

Without wasting any time, a team of doctors decided to perform a bronchoscopy to remove the cashew piece. The successful operation was carried out by a dedicated team including Dr. S.S. Kaushik, Dr. Richa Gupta, Dr. Kashmira, Dr. Krishna Gopal, Dr. Vijay Chahar, Subhash Sharma, Dinesh, Hiralal, and others.

Dr. Shiv Kaushik explained that typically, such foreign objects are removed surgically. However, given the child's young age, conventional surgery was not an option. Instead, the medical team used a bronchoscope to carefully extract the cashew piece through her mouth while she was under anesthesia.

Dr. Kaushik emphasized the critical nature of timely intervention, stating that a delay could have resulted in the swelling of the cashew piece, potentially blocking the windpipe completely and endangering the child's life.

PMCH Executive Director Aman Agarwal highlighted that the hospital's ENT department, equipped with world-class, state-of-the-art facilities and a team of specialists, has successfully removed various foreign objects such as seeds, LED bulbs, and corn kernels from the windpipes of over 60 children in the past year and a half. Chetna's family expressed their gratitude to PMCH Chairman Rahul Agarwal, the medical team, management, nursing staff, and other personnel.
