Landmark Move: One Nation, **One Election**

rime Minister Narendra Modi's government has initiated a historic change by introducing the "One Nation, One Election" concept. following its first 100 days in office. In a recent Cabinet meeting chaired by Modi in New Delhi, recommendations from a high-level committee led by former President Ram Nath Kovind were accepted. The committee proposed simultaneous elections for the Lok



in the first phase, with local body elections to follow within 100 days

This significant step aims to streamline the electoral process across India, covering 543 Lok Sabha and 4,130 state assembly seats. The initiative has received mixed reactions, with 32 out of 62 political parties, including the BJP and its allies, supporting it, while 15 parties, including Congress,

Critics argue that this shift mirrors the American electoral system and may have political motives.In defense, Modi stated that the proposal responds to public demand for stable governance, as frequent elections disrupt development

and law enforcement. Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnaw emphasized that India previously held simultaneous elections until 1967, and noted the need to revive this practice to enhance governance efficiency.

The government plans to introduce the One Nation, One Election Bill during the winter session of Parliament. If passed with a two-thirds majority, the system could be implemented by 2025, potentially reshaping India's electoral landscape and providing governments with the time needed to implement their policies effectively.

Breathing Techniques for Mental Health

Research shows this practice increases alpha and theta brain waves, promoting relaxation and mental bal ance, making it beneficial for all individuals.

Solar Cookers: Empowering Working Women
