

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## CM Excellence Award 2025: Dr. Vipin Mathur Honored for 'Mera Aspatal Meri Jimmedari' Initiative, Udaipur Earns Recognition

**Udaipur:** To promote innovative initiatives in Rajasthan's medical and health sector, the Chief Minister's Excellence Awards are presented annually on Civil Services Day. This year, RNT Medical College, Udaipur was honored at the state level. The award was presented to the college's principal and controller, Dr. Vipin Mathur, on April 21, 2025, at the state-level ceremony held at HCM RIPA Institute, Jaipur, by Chief Minister Mr. Bhajanlal Sharma. This achievement is a matter of pride not only for RNT Medical College but also for the entire Udaipur division.

**Award-Winning Initiative: "Mera Aspatal Meri Jimmedari"**  
Under the leadership of Dr.

Mathur, the "Mera Aspatal Meri Jimmedari" (My Hospital, My Responsibility) initiative has set a remarkable example of integrating technology into hospital management and cleanliness. The initiative introduced a QR code-based monitoring system in hospitals, enabling patients, their families, and hospital staff to provide direct feedback on cleanliness, hospital services, and overall experiences to the control room. Over 254 complaints regarding toilet cleanliness were registered and resolved effectively. In addition, more than 171 suggestions and complaints related to services were also received and addressed. Those submitting complaints are awarded the title of

"Chikitsalay Mitra" (Hospital Friend), and a thank-you message is sent from the principal if they provide their contact details.

**State-Level Recognition and Model for Replication**  
In January 2024, during his visit to Udaipur, Chief Minister Mr. Bhajanlal Sharma praised the initiative and named it the "Udaipur Model." Following its successful implementation, the ACS Medical and Health Department recommended adopting this system in all medical colleges across the state in March 2024.

The system has also been shortlisted at the Global Digital Health Innovation Summit in Mumbai and recognized at prestigious platforms such as



the SKOCH Order of Merit. Additionally, RNT Medical College received the "Atal E-Governance State Award" on

March 28, 2025, at the IT Day Ceremony in Jaipur for the "Chief Minister Ayushman Arogya (MAA) Scheme QR

Code System," which has enhanced transparency and accessibility in digital health services.

### Technical Role

The Community Medicine Department of RNT Medical College was responsible for the technical development of the entire system, which was created at virtually no cost.

This initiative has become a model, with recommendations for its adoption across the state.

### Dr. Vipin Mathur's Statement

On receiving the award, Dr. Vipin Mathur stated: "Cleanliness and patient-centered care are our top pri-

orities. 'Mera Aspatal Meri Jimmedari' is not just an initiative but a public participation movement. Receiving the Chief Minister's Excellence Award is an immense honor and source of inspiration for us. This day will always be memorable for our institution."

The "Mera Aspatal Meri Jimmedari" initiative stands as a unique example of cleanliness, accountability, and citizen participation. ## Naresh Kumar from Mount Abu to Contest for JNUSU Joint Secretary



**New Delhi:** Naresh Kumar, a determined voice from Rajasthan's tribal belt, is contesting for the post of Joint Secretary in the JNUSU elections 2024-25, scheduled for

April 25. A PhD scholar at JNU's Centre for the Study of Social Systems (CSSS) and a committed AISA activist for the last seven years, Naresh stands as a representative of India's most marginalized—Dalits, Adivasis, and oppressed communities—bringing their struggles to the heart of campus politics. Hailing from Morthla village in Mount Abu, Naresh's journey from a government school in a region where access to education is still a distant dream, to Delhi University's Shivaji College,

and now JNU, is a testimony to his unwavering resolve and grassroots connection.

His father, a primary school teacher, and mother, a homemaker, raised him amidst daily battles against caste and class hierarchies. At Delhi University, Naresh became a fierce political voice in the face of RSS-ABVP dominance, organizing the 'Reopen DU' movement, leading protests against the CAA-NRC, and spearheading the Metro Pass Movement. His activism, rooted in Ambedkarite ideology and

shaped by grassroots organizing, challenges the safe-fortification of campuses and reclaims student spaces for dialogue, dissent, and democracy. In JNU, Naresh has been at the forefront of key student movements—most notably the Occupy DOS protest and the Barak Hostel reopening hunger strike.

His role in redefining student politics includes raising the issues of safaikaramcharis and ensuring campus activism represents every worker and student alike.

## Takhman-28 Gives Away Awards and Prizes to Young Artists

Takhman-28, a prominent art gallery of Rajasthan and a vibrant centre for exploring, promoting, and showcasing experimental and contemporary art, organized an award ceremony of the second Dr. O.D. Upadhyaya Memorial State Art Competition for Students, along with an exhibition of winning paintings, on April 19, 2025. Sumita Saroch, Joint Director, Department of Tourism, Rajasthan, inaugurated the ceremony as chief guest. Eminent artists, Dr. Shail Choyal and Dr. Suresh Sharma, graced the occasion as special guests. ## DC Pragya Kevlramani Honoured with CM's Excellence Award

With the support of CSR funding, players received financial sponsorships to participate in national and international tournaments. Additionally, arrangements such as hockey astro turf for practice, ashram hostels for residence, and floodlights for night training were facilitated. Remarkable Achievements - With consistent motivation from the Divisional Commissioner and training under Coach Neeraj Batra, seven female and three male players represented India on international platforms. The female team won a silver medal in the Asian Championship. On the national stage, Rajasthan dominated across all categories:

Senior Women's Team: Gold in both first and second national championships, and the Federation Cup.

Junior Women's Team: Gold in both first and second editions.

Sub-Junior Women's Team: Silver in the second edition.

Senior Men's Team: Gold in the Federation Cup and second national championship.

Junior Men's Team: Gold in the first edition, bronze in the second.

Sub-Junior Men's Team: Silver in the second national competition.
