Nation First: Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla Hails Armed Forces, Warns Terror Sponsors of Fierce Retaliation

Jamshedpur : Emphasizing India's steadfast commitment to national security and self-reliance, Lok Sabha Speaker Om Birla delivered a compelling address at the Platinum Jubilee celebration of the Singhbhum Chamber of Commerce and Industry in Jamshedpur on Saturday.

Hailing the bravery and unwavering resolve of the Indian armed forces, Shri Birla

said, "India is proud of its armed forces for their courage, determination, and commitment." He strongly cautioned that any country or terrorist organization attempting to spread terror in India would face consequences graver than Operation Sindoor, sending a bold message of deterrence to adversaries.

Highlighting India's national security priorities, the Speaker asserted that a sense

of collective interest must guide the nation in all matters of defence and security. "We must remain united when it comes to our sovereignty and territorial integrity," he emphasized.

Praising the visionary leadership of the Prime Minister, Shri Birla noted that India has firmly adopted the path of Atmanirbharta (self-reliance) in defence production, aiming to transform the country into a

global hub of indigenous defence manufacturing.

He paid tribute to Bhagwan Birsa Munda, recognizing him as a symbol of tribal pride and valour. "Birsa Munda ignited a long and brave struggle for the dignity and self-respect of tribal communities," he remarked.

Looking ahead to India's developmental aspirations, Shri Birla stressed that collective efforts, technological

innovation, healthy competition, and skill development are essential components for achieving the national vision of Viksit Bharat by 2047.

The Speaker's speech, delivered at one of the oldest industrial chambers in eastern India, resonated with business leaders, policymakers, and professionals, reflecting a strong blend of economic ambition and patriotic resolve.



Chief Minister Bhajanlal Sharma Inspects Ongoing Reconstruction of Rajasthan House in New Delhi

New Delhi: Chief Minister Shri Bhajanlal Sharma visited the Rajasthan House located at Prithviraj Road, New Delhi, to inspect the progress of its reconstruction work. During the inspection, he instructed officials to accelerate the construction and ensure that the work is completed within the stipulated timeline, with strict compliance to safety standards.

Officials briefed the Chief Minister that the civil work of the underground water tank and sewage treatment plant in the lower basement has been completed. Additionally, nearly 70% of the structural work of the upper portion of the building has been completed.

The new Rajasthan House is being developed with an exquisite blend of Rajasthani architectural heritage, featuring Dholpur sandstone on the outer walls. The building includes two basements, a ground floor, and six upper floors. Facilities being constructed include parking, lobby, cafeteria, waiting area, dining area, fountains, hanging chandeliers, and a grand atrium. The first floor will house a conference hall, library, and gym, while the rooftop will feature a terrace garden, party hall, and yoga room.

Visit to Batuk Bhairav Temple - Earlier, CM Bhajanlal Sharma also visited the Batuk Bhairav Temple at Janpath Lane, managed by the Devasthan Department. He offered prayers and wished for the prosperity and well-being of the people of Rajasthan.

MP Dr. Ravat Condemns Entry Fees at Sitamata Fair

Calls for Immediate Policy Revision by District Authorities

Udaipur: Member of Parliament Dr. Mannalal Ravat has expressed strong dissatisfaction with the ongoing practice of collecting entry fees from devotees attending the Sitamata Fair at the Sitamata Wildlife Sanctuary, located in Dharaiyawad sub-division of Pratapgarh district. Taking swift action, Dr. Ravat has raised the issue with the District Collector of Pratapgarh, demanding a review and immediate suspension of the fee policy. Emphasizing the religious and cultural gravity of the Sitamata Temple, Dr. Ravat highlighted its deep-rooted connection to the Ramayana era, as it is believed to be the birthplace of Luv and Kush and the site where Goddess Sita entered the earth. Additional sacred landmarks include hot and cold springs and a Hanuman-related site, making the temple a key spiritual destination for devotees across the region. The four-day Sitamata Mela, which began this Sunday, is seeing the arrival of thousands of tribal and rural pilgrims, many of whom have been traveling for over two weeks. In this context, Dr. Ravat strongly opposed the Forest Department's fee structure—Rs. 145 per person, Rs. 55 for students, and up to Rs. 330 for vehicles. "This is not tourism, it is a sacred pilgrimage," stated Dr. Ravat.

"Charging entry during a religious fair is exploitative, especially for poor tribal devotees who are here for spiritual fulfillment, not sightseeing."

He further pointed out that Sitamata Wildlife Sanctuary is not even listed in the official fee chart issued by the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and Chief Wildlife Warden, questioning the very legitimacy of the charges.

In a telephonic conversation with the Pratapgarh Collector, Dr. Ravat demanded an immediate halt to the fee collection and urged authorities to revise the current system so that pilgrims can worship without financial burden.

The issue has sparked significant local concern, with many devotees and community leaders echoing the MP's call for the abolition of fees during religious events.



Disability Certificates to Be Issued Daily on MLA Kothari's Recommendation

Bhilwara: In a major relief for persons with disabilities in the district, disability certificates are now being issued on a daily basis at Mahatma Gandhi District Hospital, Room No. 92. Previously, these certificates were only processed on Tuesdays, causing significant inconvenience to many applicants. Concerned about the issue, several affected individuals brought the matter to the attention of city MLA Ashok Kothari. Acting swiftly, MLA Kothari ensured immediate redressal of the problem. Following his intervention, arrangements were made for the certificates to be issued every day, providing continuous assistance to the differently-abled community.
