Survey of Nazool Properties and Sajjangarh Awareness Model Proposed A significant decision was taken to create an inventory of "Nazool properties"—unused or abandoned heritage structures—by collecting data from all sub-divisional officers in the district, with the aim of initiating preservation efforts.

The committee also decided to celebrate the Chapter's Foundation Day on December 1 in a grand manner. This year marks the 40th anniversary of the chapter, and the chosen theme is "Enriching the Educational Heritage of Udaipur." Environmental initiatives were also discussed.

Under the guidance of Rahul Bhatnagar, programs will be undertaken in connection with World Wildlife Day and Forestry Day. A notable proposal passed was to create a live model of Sajjangarh Fort to raise public awareness on rainwater harvesting and sustainable conservation practices.
