

Lok Sabha Speaker Stresses Synergy, Technology, and Accountability

Mumbai: The two-day National Conference of Chairpersons of Estimates Committees of Parliament and State/UT Legislatures concluded at the Maharashtra Vidhan Bhawan with a powerful valedictory address by Lok Sabha Speaker Shri Om Birla. The event, marking 75 years of the Estimates Committee, emphasized a renewed commitment to democratic accountability, fiscal prudence, and the integration of technology into governance.

Delivering his remarks, Shri Om Birla underscored the vital role that institutional synergy, financial accountability, and technology-driven governance play in reinforcing democratic values. Stressing the importance of cooperation among various arms of government, he stated that only through coordinated and transparent systems can policies be effectively implemented and citizens' welfare truly prioritized.

Significantly, the Speaker clarified the role of Parliamentary Committees, asserting that these bodies should not be viewed as opposing the government but rather as supportive and corrective institutions. "Committees must serve as constructive platforms that bridge the executive and legislature, offering well-researched guidance and enhancing transparency," he remarked.

Calling for coordination between the Estimates Committees of Parliament and those of State/UT legislatures, Shri Birla said such alignment would amplify oversight capabilities and streamline financial scrutiny. He emphasized the importance of empowering committees with modern digital tools such as Artificial Intelligence and data analytics, enabling more accurate monitoring of public expenditure and facilitating real-time impact assessment. Highlighting the need for inclusive governance, Shri Birla reiterated that public funds must be spent for the people's welfare. Estimates Committees, he said, should ensure that every rupee is not only accounted for but is also directed toward accessible and effective welfare schemes, especially those concerning social justice. He credited initiatives like Direct Benefit Transfers for minimizing pilferage and improving efficiency, urging Committees to continue supporting such measures.
