

“Waterman” Rajendra Singh Calls Chambal a Treasure, Warns of Ecological Disaster in Shahabad

Kota: Renowned environmentalist Rajendra Singh, widely known as the “Waterman of India,” issued a dire warning on Thursday about the deteriorating condition of the Chambal River and the ecological threat looming over Shahabad’s forests. Speaking at a press conference in Kota, Singh described Chambal as “sick,” blaming government beautification projects for harming rather than healing the river. He criticized the focus on

construction instead of ecological restoration, urging tree plantation along riverbanks to revive the natural system. Singh also warned that official permissions granted in Shahabad could lead to the felling of nearly 30 lakh trees, despite lower claims by authorities. “I’m not here to scare you, but to awaken you,” he said. However, his remarks revealed disillusionment—both with the government and local water advocacy groups.

Questions about the lack of progress since his similar visit two years ago were met with vague responses.

Internal rifts between groups like the ‘Chambal Parliament’ and others like ‘Hum Log’ further exposed a

lack of unity in the movement. Singh appeared subdued, and his reliance seemed to shift from grassroots efforts to gov-

ernmental action. With limited public engagement planned, the event ended with less impact than expected.
