



# 16th National Children's Literature Conference Held in Udaipur

Speaking on the occasion, General Upendra Dwivedi described organ donation as a service to humanity and an extension of the Armed Forces' spirit of sacrifice and courage. **Hands-On Demonstrations and Scientific Guidance**—Teachers were trained to test TDS levels in drinking water and advised on safe consumption limits. Using hospital models, Dr. Jain demonstrated rooftop rainwater harvesting as the simplest and most economical method. Sharing successful case studies, he urged schools to capture rainwater on rooftops and recharge groundwater through hand pumps and tube wells, highlighting long-term benefits for students.

He also introduced the concept of virtual water—the hidden water used in producing clothing, food grains, and electronics—urging the audience to avoid unnecessary consumption as a form of water misuse.

**Cultural Segment Inspires Commitment**—The session included a Jal Geet (water song) and a dance performance featuring Manisha Joshi, Tarun Prabha Sharma, Asha Soni, Lalita Meena, and Manju Shirmali. Participants were then encouraged to pledge rooftop rainwater harvesting at their homes, setting an example for society and students alike.

**Urgent Call for Rajasthan**—Using a map of India, Dr. Jain highlighted that Rajasthan leads the country in groundwater over-extraction at 148%, making immediate conservation action more critical than ever.
