Udaipur Gears Up for Grand Navratri 2025

Udaipur: The city of lakes is abuzz with excitement as Sharadiya Navratri 2025 is set to begin on 22nd September, promising nine days of devotion, rituals, and cultural vibrancy. Devotees across Udaipur and neighboring regions will honor the nine forms of Maa Durga, with prayers, fasting, and traditional celebrations, transforming the city into a spiritual hub.

The festival begins on 22nd September with the worship of Maa Shailputri, the symbol of power and virtue. Devotees perform Ghatasthapana (Kalash Sthapana) between 6:09 AM to 8:06 AM, with Abhijit Muhurat from 11:49 AM to 12:38 PM, placing the sacred Kalash as the center of Navratri rituals. Pooja thalis are arranged with flowers, fruits, vermillion, holy water, and incense, while chanting sacred mantras such as "Sarvamangala Mangalye Shive Sarvartha Sadhike,

SharanyeTryambake Gauri Narayani Namostute."

On 23rd September, the second day, Maa Brahmacharini is worshipped, representing penance, spiritual discipline, and wisdom. Devotees observe fasting, offer lotus flowers, bel leaves, and fruits, and recite hymns to seek knowledge and tranquil-

24th and 25th September are dedicated to Maa Chandraghanta, symbolizing bravery and courage. Devotees continue their fasts and perform elaborate poojas, offering sweets, flowers, and incense, praying for protection and prosperity.

On the fourth day, 26th September, Maa Kushmanda, the creative power of the universe, is worshipped. Devotees light lamps, perform aarti, and chant:

"Om Jaianti Mangala Kali Bhadrakali Kapalini,

Durga Kshama Shiva Dhatri Swaha Swadha Namostute." The fifth day, 27th September, is for Maa Skandamata, revered



as the mother of Lord Kartikeya. Women observe fasts, offer rice, curd, and flowers, and sing devotional songs to ensure family welfare and spiritual growth.

On 28th September, the sixth day, Maa Katyayani is worshipped for courage, success, and blessings for unmarried girls seeking marital happiness. The seventh day, 29th September, celebrates Maa Kalaratri, destroyer of fear and darkness. Devotees perform rigorous pooja, aarti, and recitation of Durga Saptashati, invoking divine protection.

The eighth day, 30th September, is dedicated to Maa Mahagauri, the embodiment of purity and serenity. On this day, devotees perform Kanya Poojan, worshipping nine young girls as living forms of the goddess. These girls are offered fruits, sweets, new clothes, and blessings, while chanting:

"Ya Devi Sarvabhuteshu Shakti Rupena Samsthita,

NamastasyaiNamastasyaiNamoh

Devotees maintain strict fasts, consuming only fruits, milk, and simple vegetarian food, maintaining spiritual discipline and devotion throughout the day.

The festival concludes on 1st October with the worship of Maa Siddhidatri, the giver of knowledge, power, and fulfillment. Devotees perform pooja, aarti, and chanting of sacred hymns, concluding the Navratri with prayers for prosperity and spiritual growth.

Temples including Amba Mata Mandir, Asewari Mata, Chahumanda Mata, Chittor Garsh Ghata Mata, Badla Mata, and Veshnodevi have been decorated with lights flowers, and rangoli. Daily rituals include pooja, aarti, recitation of Durga Stotra, and bhajan sessions, cre-

ating a devotional atmosphere. Evenings will feature traditional Garba and Dandiya Raas with men and women in colorful ethnic attire dancing around the sanctified Kalash. Communities have appealed to participants to avoid filmy or vulgar songs, ensuring celebrations remain sacred and culturally rich.

Safety, seating, lighting, and emergency arrangements have been made across neighborhoods, allowing devotees of all ages to participate fully. Cultural programs, mythological storytelling, and devotional music will complement rituals, blending faith, folk traditions, and spiritual devotion.

This Navratri, Udaipur promises a perfect fusion of faith tradition, and celebration, with devotees engaging in fasting, poojas, Kanya Poojan, and Garba, honoring Maa Durga with spiritual fervor and joyous community participation.

A person holding such a high position should respect the legacy and culture of our region, not undermine

Salvi also spoke about the incident involving contract

employee Smt. Kiran Tanwar, whose Rajput attire was insultingly referred to as a bride's costume. "This is a grave insult to our traditions and the dignity of our employees," he said. "Our organization strongly condemns this humiliation. Alongside this, the recent unlawful expulsion of students from the university cannot be tolerated. The administration has crossed all imits of fairness and decency."

Highlighting employee grievances, Salvi stated, "Our fivepoint demands remain unresolved. The current work orders for employees are valid only until 30 September 2025. If the administration does not issue fresh orders or address our demands, we will be compelled to resume protests from 1 October

Salvi assured full support to Shri Karni Sena and other social and political organizations calling for a Udaipur bandh. He said, "We stand united to protect the pride of Mewar, the rights of



our employees, and the dignity of our students. The people of Udaipur will not tolerate insults to their heritage or injustice to their youth."

The emergency meeting, attend ed by all office bearers and members of the association, also heard from Dr Paramveer Singh Dulawat, Divisional President of Shri Karni Sena, who supported the call for immediate correct tive action

Salvi concluded. "We demand a public apology from Prof. Mishra and an immediate reversal of all unlawful actions. Until justice is done, our fight for dignity, respect, and employee rights will continue. Mewar's pride and the welfare of our students come first, and we will not com
