During his reign (1861–1874), the first school of Udaipur State was established in January 1863, named Shambhuratan Pathshala. In 1866, it was converted into a girls' school, becoming the first such institution set up by the Mewar State for female education in India.



Dr. Lakshyaraj Singh Mewar emphasized that girls' education is the true foundation of a strong society. Even today, many girls are forced to discontinue their studies due to family or financial hardships. Linking them to education not only secures their future but also strengthens the progress of society and the nation. Carrying forward the legacy of his ancestors, Dr. Mewar has initiated several impactful efforts in the fields of educational reform, women empowerment, animal welfare, and welfare of widows of martyrs and ex-servicemen.
